The NFFR founded and remains the funding arm of the Institute of Reconstructive Plastic Surgery (IRPS) at NYU Langone Medical Center. The Institute diagnoses and provides medical treatment and psychosocial services for over 2,000 patients every year, regardless of the severity of their condition, the length of treatment or the family's ability to afford care. 72% of the patients seen at the Institute are uninsured, Medicaid recipients or "clinic" care patients.
